
## OLD SEDGWICK COUNTY FAIR EDUCATION DAY



The schools and shops were closed so all the people in town could go. Farmers and cowboys would ride their horses many miles to get to the county fair. Important people would come to the county fair from far away.









Who else might like to come to a county fair in the 1870s?

See if you can help these people from the 1870s find their way through the maze so they can get to the county fair.



Salesmen would have new things for people to buy. Churches would sell food and drinks. Farmers would show off their horses, cows, pigs and sheep. Many men and women would enter special contests



In 1870, all the people in town came to the county fair to see what was new and better. The farmers and their wives would bring their finest animals, vegetables, sewing and cooking to the fair.



They wanted to have the best so they could win a ribbon in the contest. The best exhibit at the fair got a blue ribbon. The second best got a red ribbon and the third best got a white ribbon.

Sometimes the county fair would be canceled if the crops didn't grow, or the grasshoppers came and ate them. The county never gave up. They would always try to have a county fair again the next year. In the 1870s, the county fair was the most important event of the year. Everyone in the county came to the fair to learn and to have fun.
